The initial app will launch with exercises for piano students up to and including grade 3. The app is free for NZMEB teachers, and there is an annual cost of \$59 for students. It is initially available on apple ipad and iphone, but is in development to launch on android devices. We will keep you posted with updates. IRMTNZ Conference Ignite

NCEA

Those entrants who sat an NCEA assessment within the December 2023 practical examining session should receive their results in the post by the end of March, beginning of April.

Due to the extra moderation NZMEB has in place, the NCEA Assessment process can take approximately 3 months to show on the entrant's NZQA framework, therefore if a student is requiring to access the NCEA credits in the year they are sitting their exam, we suggest they enter into the August practical session.

Level 1 NCEA Changes

With the changes that have been made to NCEA level 1 Music coming into effect this year, we would like to take this opportunity to explain how this affects your entrant's NCEA assessment that is undertaken with their NZMEB exam.

In level 1 the following two standards have now expired -91090 (featured soloist) and 91091 (ensemble skills). They have been replaced by one standard - AS91949 - which will cover both solo and ensemble performance. Entrants will only have to nominate 1 piece for the assessment of this standard, and it is now worth 5 credits. Refer to the <u>NZQA website</u> for further details.
