Exam Entries News

Future Entries

In future, we will accept entries with either a student number or a student name and date of birth. This obviates the necessity to ask a student for their date of birth every time. Teachers might like to also fill in the student name field (as a check!). New entrants will need to have name and date of birth supplied. Teachers can obtain a list of their student numbers if they would like this ahead of the next round of entries. This is intended to make it easier for teachers to enter students and not an extra task for you. If you do not have the student number, we will find it for you when we receive the entry. The student name is not expected to be a different thing from year to year so if you do have a change to a name, you will need to separately identify this to us.

Practical exams in August and September this year

Just a reminder to you all that the exams this year are 15th August to 15th September. This move in dates is to align with the school term dates for 2011 and is not planned to be a permanent move of our exam dates. Teachers who have entered students should have received a confirmation at the beginning of this month. Teachers will receive exam entrant slips before the end of term 2. The scheduling is currently underway.
